### Reflection on Mock Report Cards

Writing a report card for a semi-fictional student was an interesting process. It was interesting to try and create comments for the subjects that I had not observed. Doing report cards always makes you think about the student more deeply. I have found that it is easy to make quick conclusions during the class when the student is in front of you, but when you go back to think over the class and how everyone did, you can see things in a different way, or shall we say, a little more objectively!

The process of having my peers give feedback on my report card comments was valuable. It both confirmed that I was doing some things well while at the same time pointing out some mistakes or areas for improvement.

After being through this assessment class, I'm still undecided if I like the use of rubrics on report cards. I don't like the letter grades and section headings (not yet meeting, meeting, etc.). I would rather have an arrow and/or be able to customize the rubric for reporting purposes. I think the move to ePortfolios will help with this a lot. I believe that seeing how your child is doing at any time by following their progression is absolutely wonderful.

As a parent it is difficult when the only communication you get is the 3 times-a-year report card unless they've done something really bad. It is important to have frequent communication with parents and students, even just to let them know they are progressing very well in their learning.
